POSITION SUMMARY

This position is in partnership between the Confluence Environmental Center, AmeriCorps Program, and Housing Authority of Clackamas County (HACC). The goal for the AmeriCorps Member is to address issues around food insecurity and disparities in healthy food access in Public Housing communities with low-incomes.

The Member's time will be split between engaging housing residents in gardening and coordinating other health and wellness education activities for two community garden sites in the public housing neighborhoods of Hillside Park and Manor in Milwaukie, and Clackamas Heights in Oregon City (40%). In addition, the Member will engage youth in the Summer Lunch Program (20%).

To understand the underlying components of food insecurity, the Member will spend time assessing access to food systems as they currently exist, in addition to strengthen collaborations with our local partners who are focused on the same issues. These partners include the Oregon Food Bank Seed to Supper and Free Food Market programs, OSU Extension Food Resource Management Services, Providence Milwaukie Hospital Teaching Kitchen, Clackamas County Public Health, ESD Summer Lunch Program and area food pantries (20%).

The Member will participate in Confluence led leadership development activities which include: Leadership Development Training Series, completing a Change Agent Project (CAP), team meetings, National Service events and other self-directed development opportunities (20%).

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS (to include, but not limited to):

- Run weekly Community Garden check-ins to support gardeners at both community gardens in propagation, planting, maintenance and harvesting activities throughout the growing season.
- Coordinate garden work parties and other community events to maintain the gardens and collaborate on community projects.
- Coordinate with community partners that focus on food insecurity and health and wellness initiatives to provide garden and health workshops in public housing neighborhoods.
- Design and create outreach materials to engage public housing residents in community garden and Youth Summer Lunch programming.
- Recruit a diverse community of public housing gardeners to become leaders and change agents on food insecurity and other important issues in their communities.
- Manage, coordinate, and track ongoing data related to volunteer and community gardener hours and summer lunch program attendance.
- Complete and submit all necessary Confluence/AmeriCorps/Summer Lunch Program paperwork and reports in a timely manner.
- Comply with HACC, Confluence/AmeriCorps, and Youth Summer Lunch program policies.
- Attend and complete all HACC/Confluence/AmeriCorps/Summer Lunch training and service requirements including orientation, trainings, team meetings and national service days.
- Wear Confluence uniform and/or appropriate identifiers and required safety gear while performing service or attending official events.

POSITION REQUIREMENTS

- Proven organizational skills.
- Ability and willingness to communicate in a positive and professional manner to a wide range of stakeholders, including community gardeners, HACC staff and partner organizations.
- Joyfully work in inclement weather, ability to dig, kneel and lift 50 pounds.
- Willingness/openness to learn about and discuss racial equity and social justice issues.
- Ability to serve independently and as part of a diverse team.
- Regular and reliable attendance and dependability.
- AmeriCorps Members must be: 18 years of age or older at beginning of service term; U.S. citizen, national or lawful permanent resident; in possession of a high school diploma or equivalent, or commit to earning one prior to receiving education award; able to commit to the full term of service; able to successfully pass a fingerprint criminal history background check and satisfactory report from the National Sex Offender Public Website (NSOPW) prior to the start of the position.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- An Associate's or Bachelor's degree is preferred.
- Hands on experience growing food in medium-scale garden environment.
- Experience working with issues of food insecurity, diverse cultural populations, people of color, immigrant or refugee populations, or those with limited economic means.
- Knowledge of/interest in sustainability & permaculture models of landscaping & agriculture production.
- Skills as a garden and social justice educator.

- \$16,502 living allowance paid over the 11-month term of service (approx. \$1,500 monthly, before taxes).
- \$6,495 education award (qualified student loans and/or education expenses)
